



ACLS HUMANITIES E-BOOK

ACLS Humanities E-Book (HEB) is a collaboration among 20 learned societies, over 100 publishers, and librarians at the University of Michigan's Scholarly Publishing Office. The result is an online, fully searchable collection of high-quality books in the humanities, recommended and reviewed by scholars and featuring unlimited, multi-user access and free, downloadable MARC records and stats. HEB is available on- and off-campus through standard web browsers. Self-sustaining since 2005, HEB was initially funded by a grant from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. HEB TITLES

ACLS Humanities E-Book includes the full text of 2,800 titles selected by scholars across the humanities. (See back panel.) Approximately 500 titles are added each year. The collection includes both in- and out-of-print titles ranging from the 1880s through the present. Titles link to publishers' websites and to online reviews in JSTOR, Project MUSE, and other sites. Titles offer standardized annotation and citation methods and full cross-searchability. XML TITLES

HEB continues to build its list of XML titles ranging from print-first to robust born-digital works. It also offers a complete suite of tools and features replicable for any publishing XML workflow. A total of over 90 current and forthcoming titles include parallel texts and images, hi-res image viewing, sound, video, digital archives, interactive mapping, virtual-reality reconstructions, reviews, related scholarship, and other resources. SEARCH AND BROWSE

[Search](#) options include simple, Boolean, proximity, and bibliographic, plus full-text, author, title, subject, publisher, or special series. Search histories are included. Users may [browse](#) by title, author, or subject. Browsing by subject provides a full listing of Library of Congress subjects drawn dynamically from the HEB collection's MARC records, provided free.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

HEB is supported by subscribers throughout the world, ranging from secondary schools and community colleges to major research institutions. Annual subscriptions range from \$450 to \$3,125, depending on the size of the institution. Prices are guaranteed for the first three years of the contract. Consortial discounts are available.
