

Fast Track to an Institutional Repository

Criteria for Selecting a Pilot Project

- Broad cross-section of campus constituencies.
- Content from faculty, students, and staff.
- Variety of media and file types – video, PowerPoint slide shows, artwork, research posters, digital photos of exhibits.
- Event-driven and thematic – an event in which there is demand for content even after the event has been completed.
- Opportunity for the library to support a high-profile campus event.
- Timely and fast – a collection that would be relevant to dialogue on campus, and a collection we could build quickly.
- Opportunities for collaboration with a broad community, possibly outside of Bucknell.
- The first collection would *not* be library-centric.
