

**ECURE 2000: PRESERVATION AND ACCESS
FOR ELECTRONIC COLLEGE AND
UNIVERSITY RECORDS CONFERENCE**

Arizona State University

Mesa Hilton Pavilions, October 5-6, 2000



Scope: An interdisciplinary conference designed to attract college and university information creators and those charged with stewardship of their products. Marketed by press releases to publications and Internet listservs of a variety of professional organizations and accrediting agencies.

Speakers: Presenters were selected from the communities of university attorneys, registrars and admissions professionals, archivists, records managers, librarians and technology professionals who are conducting research or have experience with electronic records creation, interoperability, transmission, preservation and legal issues.

Attendance: Approximately 85 individuals including 60 registered participants, 16 presenters, conference committee members and VIP's. 50 of 60 registrants (83%) originated from other states. Breakdown of professional communities represented (registrants only):

ECURE INVITATIONAL EXECUTIVE DEVELOPMENT SEMINARS

**ECURE 2001: Preservation and Access
for Electronic University Records
October, 2001**

Conference co-chairs are soliciting proposals for sessions, individual presentations and poster sessions at ECURE 2001 – Preservation and Access for Electronic College and University Records. ECURE 2001 will be held in the Phoenix metropolitan area in October 2001 (pending notification of external funding in November 2000). Conference papers and materials will be posted to the ECURE web site shortly after the conference.

CONFERENCE THEMES INCLUDE:

- Identifying and managing electronic records
- Electronic records and distance education
- Metadata and cataloging
- Search and retrieval of electronic records
- Security of electronic records
- Electronic records issues in designing and implementing portals
- FERPA and privacy issues
- Managing electronic research data
- Email and original digital records
- Web based electronic records
- Migration of traditional records to electronic formats
- Training, education, and user awareness

ECURE strives to attract proposals that focus upon case studies and presentations of practical solutions to electronic records problems in higher education. A goal of the ECURE conference is to share practical solutions, model policies and procedures, and application development projects in progress. These elements will be emphasized in the evaluation and selection process.

DEADLINES

Proposals will be accepted until **March 3, 2001** (see **Error! Bookmark not defined.** below). Selected presenters will be notified by **April 9, 2001**. Presenters will receive free admission to the conference and complimentary lodging at the conference hotel for up to three nights. Final papers or materials are due **September 15, 2001** for inclusion in the conference notebook and on the conference web site.

PROPOSAL SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS:

Proposals should include complete speaker's contact information including name, job title, institution, address, phone, fax, email address, brief biographical information, and an abstract of 250-500 words. Also required is the planned presentation length and format, and any media or facilities requirements. Please e-mail your proposal to rob.spindler@asu.edu or jeremy.rowe@asu.edu by March 3, 2001.

PRESENTATIONS

Proposals will be considered for the concurrent 60 and 90 minute sessions and 15-minute poster sessions. Session proposals including more than one speaker are acceptable, although complete contact information for all speakers must be included in the proposal. The completed proposal represents a commitment on the part of all presenters listed, so it is expected that proposed presenters will have agreed to speak before their name is included in a proposal.
