ii. Youth Are Becoming Increasingly Risk Adverse and Preoccupied With Reputation Management



In 2019, two-thirds of college admissions officers (68%) thought it was "fair game" to review applicants' social media profiles on sites like Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

But the share of admissions officers checking social media posts is declining; it was 29% in 2019 compared to 40% in 2015.

A 2012 Pew Research Center survey of teens (12-17 year old) found:

- 59% have deleted or edited something that they posted in the past
- 53% have deleted comments from others on their profile or account
- 45% have removed their name from photos that have been tagged to identify them
- 31% have deleted or deactivated an entire profile or account
- 19% have posted updates, comments, photos, or videos that they later regretted sharing

2. Obligations

2.1 Service Eligibility

The Services are not for use by anyone under the age of 16.


iii. Political Positions Are At Risk of Calcifying At a Younger Age

Identities and political perspectives will be calcified not necessarily because people are resistant or unable to change but rather because the past will continue to define who one is in the present and future.

In a world that where partisan politics and extremism continue to gain ground, this may ultimately be the real consequence of coming of age in an era when childhood and adolescence replay on an endless digital loop.
