HED deserves better ebooks!

- Finding and reading ebooks frustrating
- For each platform, a new access experience
- Different UX creates research uncertainty
- Nearly impossible to read on mobile device
- Readers not part of the market convo



Let's make it better

- One UX for reading all UC Library eBooks
 - OA, free-to-read, + licensed
- Modern reading experience across most devices
- 1-click eBook download to phones and tablets
- Policy controls that protect user privacy
- A UX that is ADA compliant.



Seize the moment

- NYU, Columbia >> Palace (or SimplyE) pilots
- UC saw an oppty to partner on Palace support

 Peer institutions and Lyrasis
- Negotiate with platforms across community
- Share costs of development
- Hey, reading should be fun!

- Multiple phases, with potential implementation

- Platforms
- Acquisitions
- Catalog Integration
- AuthN x 10 (+ ?)
- Discovery / Access
- Oh, yeah: Training / Outreach



1. Platforms

- Many platforms not ready
 - Often only PDFs (no EPUBs)
 - Reliant on streaming (not content packages)
 - Chapter or section based (not whole book)
 - Different auth expectations
 - Don't support direct content access
 - Can't formulate OPDS catalogs



2. Acquisitions etc.

- Palace underscores content incoherence
- They say, we say ... Living in a state of limbo
- UC follows tiered acquisitions
- Many, many small niches
 - (that might get thrown under the bus)



3. Catalog integration

- OMG I don't understand how this works
- Ebook entries in Alma? Primo? Palace?
- No common internal workflow in place
- Skip



4. Authentication

- UC is 10 campuses plus UCOP, ANR, DoE labs
- No single, comprehensive auth system
- SimpleSAML works for now, mostly
- Following FedCM work closely



5. Discovery & Access

- Palace experience is mobile based (for now)
- Ebook discovery is web based (for now)
 - Catalog discovery and access, and
 - Separate web presence for Palace
- Integration web+mobile awkward
- Linking auth states forces page views
